Scouting History – 100 years ago

In 1914, British Army officer Robert Baden-Powell initiated what would become the Cub Scouts program. It was based on Rudyard Kipling's *Jungle Book,* from which a strong influence remains today. The terms "Law of the Pack," "Akela," "Wolf Cub," "grand howl," "den," and "pack" all come from the *Jungle Book.* At the same time, the Gold and Silver Arrow Points, Webelos emblem, and Arrow of Light emblem are taken from our American Indian heritage.
